New Security Architecture in Europe and its impact on Georgia - one year since European Perspective

On June 15, three organizations - "Civil Idea", "Democracy Research Institute" (DRI), and "Democracy Index - Georgia" held a conference "New Security Architecture in Europe and its impact on Georgia - one year since European Perspective".

EU CANDIDACY CHECK - how is Georgia progressing towards fulfilling 12 priorities defined by the EU

9 civil society organizations presented the fourth edition of an assessment document – EU CANDIDACY CHECK, which reflects the progress achieved by the Georgian authorities.

According to CSOs' assessments, at this stage, one priority is fully implemented, two priorities are mostly fulfilled, five priorities are partially fulfilled, and four priorities defined by the European Union are to be fulfilled.
