DRI activities in March

- According to the de facto public defender of occupied Abkhazia, there is an alarming situation in prisons of Abkhazia
- DRI files a constitutional lawsuit regarding the criminal norm relating to the damage/destruction of another person's property committed by a group
- The number of questions sent by MPs to the security sector is still critically low in 2024

DRI in Coalition activities

- We call on the authority to stop the campaign of discrediting judges with a dissenting opinion
- The matter of assessing the integrity of judges cannot be dismissed, as it reflects the desire of the Georgian people to enhance the judiciary and pursue integration into the European Union
